Bill's Story

Bill Uehlinger lived fully, loved deeply, and treasured every moment with his family. He was a devoted husband, father, son, and friend whose energy and presence filled every room. Above all, Bill cherished time with his children — whether cheering from the sidelines, playing catch in the yard, or simply being present for life's everyday moments.

Bill's battle with colon cancer was unexpected and devastating. What began as concerning symptoms quickly became a life-altering diagnosis. Despite treatment and an unwavering determination to fight, the disease progressed far too aggressively. Throughout his journey, Bill showed remarkable strength and courage, always focused on his family and on making the most of the time he had. His experience underscored the urgent importance of early detection and screening — a message that now fuels the mission of the **Bill Uehlinger Live For More Tomorrows Foundation**.

Dedicated to Service

Service was at the heart of who Bill was. His love for Sigma Nu ran deep, and his years as an advisor to the chapter at the University of Akron were among his most meaningful commitments. He mentored young men not just in leadership, but in integrity, accountability, and service to



others. Sigma Nu's motto of service shaped Bill's life, and until the very end, he continued to serve his community and instill those values in the students he advised. That legacy lives on today. In addition to supporting Emma and Will's future college education, the foundation proudly provides scholarships for current Sigma Nu students at the University of Akron — investing in young leaders who embody the same spirit of service Bill championed.

This August, just weeks after our annual golf outing, Bill's daughter Emma will begin high school — a milestone her dad would have embraced with pride and maybe a few tears. Though he cannot be there for this rite of passage, we know he is looking down on his beloved daughter, beaming. Emma has discovered a passion for cheer leading, building on her love of dance — something Bill never missed and always loved watching her perform.

His son Will is now in junior high and has grown into an exceptional baseball player. This summer, he will travel to Cooperstown for tournament play — an experience Bill would have taken in fully, savoring every inning and every family memory. Baseball was a special bond between Bill and Will, built on shared time, encouragement, and love of the game.



Though Bill cannot be here for these milestones, his legacy is felt in every achievement, every act of service, every cheer, and every swing of the bat. Through advocacy for early screening, scholarship support, and community service, we honor his life by working to create more tomorrows.

“Raising two children without Bill has been the greatest challenge of my life,” Lisa shares. “There are milestones that feel heavy without him standing beside us. But I see him in Emma’s strength and in Will’s determination every single day. Bill would be incredibly proud of the young adults they are becoming.”

Extended Chapter Support

The impact of stable housing extends far beyond basic needs. Students with reliable housing often achieve stronger academic outcomes, experience reduced stress, and enjoy greater emotional well-being. A consistent living environment also fosters a sense of belonging and security, helping students build confidence and develop meaningful social connections. Together, these benefits empower students to thrive—and to further extend their positive impact within the community.

Giving Families a Break from the Realities of Cancer Treatment

Creating Meaningful Moments with One Day to Remember

More than 5 million children in the U.S. have a parent battling cancer—often shifting family time and resources away from connection. One Day to Remember, founded in 2016 by oncology nurse Rachel Antin, bridges that gap by providing cost-free, customized family experiences for those facing advanced-stage cancer. Each experience is tailored to the family and captured through professional photography, preserving meaningful moments.

The Impact of Financial and Emotional Strain

Cancer places a heavy financial burden on families, from medical expenses to lost income, while children face emotional challenges that can be eased through shared moments of joy. By removing financial and logistical barriers, One Day to Remember allows families to focus on time together.

A Commitment to Compassion

In 2025, The Bill “Flounder” Uehlinger Live More Tomorrows Foundation supported One Day to Remember with a \$2,500 donation, helping extend its reach. Since its founding, the nonprofit has served more than 500 families. Reflecting on the impact of this support, One Day to Remember shared:

Supporting Colon Cancer Awareness

Early Action Saves Lives

Colon and rectal cancers — often referred to together as colorectal cancer — remain among the most commonly diagnosed cancers in the United States.

In 2025, it is estimated that:

- **More than 150,000 Americans will be diagnosed with colorectal cancer.**
- **Nearly 53,000 lives will be lost to the disease.**

If you are 45 or older — or experiencing **symptoms** —
talk to your doctor about screening.

If you have a **family history**, ask whether you should begin even earlier.

If you are unsure, **start the conversation.**

One appointment can change the course of a life.

Together, we can reduce stigma, increase screening, and
create more tomorrows.

While screening efforts have reduced rates among older adults, a troubling trend continues to emerge: incidence is rising in younger adults. Cases among individuals under age 50 have increased steadily over the past decade, reinforcing that this is no longer a disease that affects only older populations. This reality makes awareness, advocacy, and early detection more critical than ever.

The Power of Early Detection

Colon cancer often begins as small, non-cancerous polyps that can be identified and removed before they become cancerous. When detected early, colorectal cancer is highly treatable and survival rates are significantly higher. Today, many medical organizations recommend beginning routine screening at age 45 — and even earlier for those with family history or additional risk factors. Symptoms may not appear in early stages, which is why proactive screening is so important. A simple conversation with your healthcare provider can save your life.

Turning Awareness Into Action

The Bill Uehlinger Live For More Tomorrows Foundation is committed not only to honoring Bill's legacy, but to actively raising awareness about colon cancer prevention and screening.

Each year, foundation members proudly participate in the Walk to End Colon Cancer, standing alongside survivors, families, and advocates to support research, education, and prevention efforts. This annual event is a powerful reminder that we are not alone in this fight — and that together, we can drive change.

The foundation also participates in the Fight Colorectal Cancer Wall of Champions, an initiative led by Fight Colorectal Cancer that honors individuals affected by colorectal cancer while raising critical awareness nationwide. Displayed each year in Washington, D.C., the Wall of Champions features powerful personal stories and images of patients, survivors, and loved ones — putting real faces to the disease and reinforcing the urgent need for screening, research funding, and policy support. By contributing to this effort, the foundation helps amplify voices, reduce stigma, and inspire action on a national stage.

Advocacy also extends closer to home. Each year, Bill's wife, Lisa Uehlinger, successfully petitions the State of Ohio to issue an official proclamation recognizing March as Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month. This ongoing effort helps elevate awareness across the state, encouraging more individuals and families to prioritize screening and early detection.

Through community engagement, education, and advocacy, we work to ensure that more families understand the importance of early detection and timely screening.
